EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH SERIES

Preschool - Grade 2 60-minute Primary Programs

Celebrate Chinese New Year

An introduction to the Chinese New Year Festival, students learn through hands-on stations with authentic clothing, objects and a make-and-take project that brings this celebration to life.

World Food: What Should I Eat?

Explore the use and impact of corn, rice and wheat in world cultures. Hands-on stations include measurement, setting an international table, and a make-and-take project.

WORLD CLOTHING: What Should I Wear?

A fun program explores how people's geographic location influences their choices in what to wear. Interactive stations include clothing to try on, a matching game with international dolls, and an art project.

Grades 3-6 75-minute Intermediate Programs

Cultural Aspects of Clothing

Through interactive stations and hands-on activities, students examine how people's cultural background, geography, and climate affect the clothing they wear.

Chinese New Year Traditions

Study the traditions and customs of Chinese New Year, learn some Mandarin phrases and create an authentic make-and-take project.

World Food: Great Grains

Examine three major grains (corn, rice and wheat), why people around the world traditionally grow, cultivate, and eat those grains, and what part they play in daily life.

Through hands-on stations and activities, students explore three major regions of Brazil and how climate, geography and natural resources affect the way people live.

Learn about flags, governments, and the reason we have a constitution. Students will create their own country, come up with a constitution, design a flag, and decide how they want their country to run.

Culture comes to life through hands-on stations, art and authentic objects as students learn about this significant Mexican celebration of ancestors. Adaptable for middle/high school groups, this program gives important context to Day of the Dead and its role in Mexican culture and heritage.

Welcome Home, Japan
